Transportation Funding – Stuck in Reverse

By law, the regional Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) adopted by the Wilmington Area Planning Council (WILMAPCO) must be fiscally constrained, meaning that it has to reflect the resources available to fund the projects. Because of the inability of the General Assembly to adopt a more robust revenue package for the Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) this year, the TIP will actually see a reduction in funding of 6%. A significant number of high-profile projects have been pushed back or had their construction funding eliminated. WILMAPCO will accept comments on the amended [FY2015-18 TIP](#) until September 10.

The problem of insufficient transportation funding at both the state and federal level will be the focal point of WILMAPCO's biennial Our Town Forum to be held on Wednesday, September 3. Both the TIP and the 2040 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) will also be discussed. The forum will be held at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Newark from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm.
