DE Relief Grants give Delaware small businesses and nonprofits access to funds to cover expenses and provide relief related to COVID-19. The program, which has at least \$100 million in funds available, is a joint initiative from the State and New Castle County.

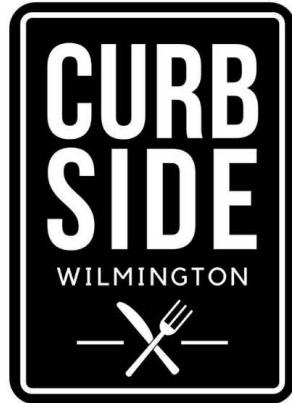
